Service Update

Make a Difference Day - October 3, 2025

Alumni Spotlight

Matthew Hutchison, 2003

Matthew Hutchison graduated from JCCS in 2003, after helping his fellow Royals, coached by Mr. Sells, win their first-ever ACSI State Soccer Championship in 2002. As a junior, Hutch applied to the United States Military Academy and impressed the Congressional Interview Committee with tales of "leadership" and "adventure" on a school trip to France led by Mrs. McGurn. During his senior year, to complete his admission packet, he had to have a final medical evaluation in Columbus and just barely made it back in time to perform in "My Fair Lady," directed by Mrs. Bullard, who had convinced him he could sing. Because of that encouragement, he currently sings tenor in the 40-member choir of his church, First Baptist of Augusta. By the Lord's personal and powerful providence, Matt achieved admission to West Point and graduated as part of "the long gray line" in 2007. He has since made the Army his career and is currently stationed at Fort Gordon, where this past June, he was installed as the Battalion Commander of the 782nd Military Intelligence (Cyber) Battalion in charge of 700 soldiers across three states. As a lieutenant colonel with a Master's degree in Cybersecurity from Carnegie Mellon University, he has written speeches for generals thanks to the writing skills he first learned in Mrs. Courtney's English classes. In 2011, Matt married Jena, also a lieutenant colonel, who serves as Battalion Commander of the 124th Mobile Public Affairs Detachment with the Georgia National Guard. Together, they have three children, Henry (12), Luke (9), and Jane (7), all of who happily attend Community Christian School in Augusta, Georgia.
